

## The Facts

- 4,771 children were considered homeless in the city of St. Louis during the 2018-2019 school year.
- Shelter insecurity affects all aspects of a child's life education, health, sense of safety, and overall development.
- Early intervention can mitigate the effects of homelessness on children and youth.



## **Our Solution**

Together Achieving Goals (TAG) is a program for the children and youth in Humanitri's Transformational Housing Program. It combines independent learning via Google Classroom and in-person visits to reinforce the Social Emotional Learning (SEL) and financial literacy curriculum as well as physical fitness. The children work with an Occupational Therapist to focus on skill development in three main areas: home management, financial management, and overall personal responsibility/self-management.

The TAG Program is designed to complement the existing parent program with the intention that families will work together, create opportunities to collaborate, and achieve goals collectively. Humanitri's 2-generational approach focuses on services and opportunities for the whole family to help break the cycle of crisis and poverty and point them towards a more hopeful future.

Develop proficiency in the areas of home management, financial management, and personal responsibility.



Instill a sense of confidence in their abilities to succeed.



Establish continuity within the household by mirroring the parent program currently in place at Humanitri.
